

Pastoral Letter

Dearly beloved in Christ,

Grace and peace from God our Father and from Jesus Christ - Our Saviour, King and LORD!

Can Christians get Tattoos?

In today's modern world, having a tattoo is a style quotient among the youth. The desire to look "Cool" and "Stylish" has led many youngsters to have tattoos all over their bodies. Tattooing has become a symbol of style and affluence today!

But could a child of GOD A believing Christian Have tattoos on their bodies? Let us see what the Bible teaches about this topic!

The most important Bible verse on this subject is Leviticus 19:28, where GOD specifically instructs Israelites not to make any engravings or piercings on their bodies.

"'Do not cut your bodies for the dead or put tattoo marks on yourselves. I am the Lord." Lev 19:28

Why did GOD say this? Because the signs often engraved on the bodies of the people were symbolic to worshipping pagan gods of their lands. The engraved symbols associated to evil practices or rituals. Even today the African tribes mark tattoos with various symbols on their bodies as a sign of protection against voodoo and witchcraft.

Now you may say well we just do it for style or even have only Christian tattoos!

But may I remind you that your Body is the temple of the Holy Spirit and not your own. You have been bought with a price(1 Cor 6:19-20, 1 Cor 3:16, Romans 6:13). We need to preserve/protect your body from associating it with any evil pagan practices and sexual immorality (Romans 12:1).

Further some may also ask Why should we obey something from Old Testament (Mosaic Law)? Are we not free from law through Jesus Christ? (Romans 10:4, Gal 2:16). Jesus Christ did not come to this world to destroy the law, but to fulfil it (Matt 5:17). He fulfilled it by His death upon the cross (Gal 3:13) and established a new covenant for us to fulfil it in the embodiment of love and grace (Matt 22:35-40). If we love GOD (which according to Jesus is the first commandment), we will not associate ourselves with any practices of pagan gods.

The other question to consider is "Does a tattoo bring glory to GOD!". Is it not just a symbol of style even among the non-believing evil world? The Bible says we (believing Christians) are the "Salt" of the earth, and if the salt loses its savour, it is of no worth (Matt 5:13). To be the Salt, is to be set apart for GOD and away from the evil practices of the world. We should not try to mix up with the evil world in our style and lifestyle (We are in the world, but not of the world John 15:19). Further to mention, Tattoos are marks which cannot be erased in your lifetime (unless to undergo complex medical procedures). It is like putting on a makeup, which you can never wash away in your life!

So, we can conclude that it is not good for Christians to have any tattoos on their bodies. But if they already have them (ignorantly before knowing God), they need not make attempts to erase them (involving medical complexities). They can pray to GOD about it, convey their situation and live with them under grace!

Rev. John Wesley's

Aldersgate Experience (The Founder of Methodism) May 24, 1738

"In the evening I went very unwillingly to a society in Aldersgate Street, where one was reading Luther's preface to the Epistle to the Romans. About a quarter before nine, while he was describing the change which God works in the heart through faith in Christ, I felt my heart strangely warmed. I felt I did trust in Christ, Christ alone for salvation, and an assurance was given me that he had taken away my sins, even mine and saved me from the law of sin and death." - Rev. John Wesley

It was 24 May 1738. Wesley was almost 35 years old and had been ordained for nearly 10 years. The 'society' he attended was a Moravian meeting in London. Wesley has first encountered the Moravian Church during a difficult two-year mission to Georgia in North America, from which he had returned just six months earlier. During the journey, their ship had been struck by a severe storm, and shipwreck and death seemed inevitable to most aboard. What Wesley noticed was the calm assurance of the Moravians: confident in God's love and their salvation, they did not appear to fear death. Wesley did not have that assurance. He was struggling at this point in his life, when it was far from certain that the beginnings of a religious revival would take hold and flourish. John Wesley's experience at the Aldersgate meeting transformed his belief and preaching, ultimately leading to the formation of the Methodist Church. Without Aldersgate, Methodism as we know it today may not have happened.

Wesley's experience that night was a conversion. He experienced a "conversion" in thinking and understanding about the nature of grace and salvation. That night Wesley realized that forgiveness of sins and acceptance by God (justification) is a free gift. Nothing we can do will every make us worthy or acceptable. God did the work of atonement on the cross in the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. On May 24, 1738 Wesley's was awakened to the truth Paul writes in Ephesians 2:8, 'For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God.'

But Aldersgate is not just about the past, or just about John Wesley. His experience, so memorably and vividly expressed in his journal, demonstrates the difference it makes knowing God for ourselves. When one least expects it, even when things haven't turned out the way we hoped or when we feel we've heard it all before, there can be change. Change happens when we share the story. Wesley experienced this when someone else read to him Martin Luther's Preface to Romans. Just as John Wesley felt his heart 'strangely warmed', we too can be refreshed and inspired by sharing our faith stories with each other.
