No.1- WE ARE THE PILGRIMS OF GOD: Peter addresses the believers by saying in 1 Peter 2:11, 'Dear friends I urge you as foreigners and exiles abstain from sinful desires, which wage war against your soul'. You and I are also, sojourners and pilgrims.

We are not yet home. We must be careful of thinking of this present world in which we live. Though we are in this world, we are not of the world. We need to know that this world is going to go down in flames someday. James strongly speaks to those who love this present age more than God in James 4:4. He says, 'whosoever therefore will be a friend of the world is the enemy of God.' We must remember that we are God's elect pilgrims. What does it mean to be elect? It means to be chosen by God. Who are these elect? You are, if you are a child a God. You belong to Him, You are His chosen, 1 Peter 2:9 says 'But you are a special people, a holy nation, priests and kings, a people given up completely to God, so that you may make clear the virtues of him who took you out of the dark into the light of heaven.' Hence, we are to live in this world as pilgrims of God.



Missionary Biography: William Carey

"Shoemaker by trade, but scholar, linguist and missionary by God's training," William Carey was one of God's giants in the history of evangelism! One of his biographers, F. Dealville Walker, wrote of Carey: "He, with a few contemporaries, was almost singlehanded in conquering the prevailing indifference and hostility to missionary effort; Carey developed a plan for missions, and printed his amazing Enquiry; he influenced timid and hesitating men to take steps to the evangelizing of the world." Another wrote of him, "Taking his life as a whole, it is not too much to say that he was the greatest and most versatile Christian missionary sent out in modern times."

Carey was born in a small thatched cottage in Paulerspury, a typical Northamptonshire village in England, August 17, 1761, of a weaver's family. When about eighteen he left the Church of England to "follow Christ" and to "...go forth unto Him without the camp, bearing His reproach." At first he joined the Congregational church at Hackleton where he was an apprentice shoemaker. It was there he married in 1781. And it was in Hackleton he began

making five-mile walks to Olney in his quest for orspiritual truth. Olney was a stronghold of the Particular Baptists, the group that Carey cast his lot with after his baptism, October 5, 1783. Two vears later he moved to Moulton to become a schoolmaster and a year later he became pastor of the small Baptist congregation there.

It was in Moulton that Carey heard the missionary call. In his own words he cried, "My attention to missions was first awakened after I was at Moulton, by reading the Last Voyage of Captain Cook." To many, Cook's Journal was a thrilling story of adventure, but to Carey it was a revelation of human need! He then began to read every book that had any bearing on the subject. (This, along with his language study for at twenty-one years of age Carey had mastered Latin, Greek, Hebrew and Italian, and was turning to Dutch and French. One well called his shoemaker's cottage "Carey's College," for as

he cobbled shoes along with his preaching he never sat at his bench without some kind of a book before him.)

The more he read and studied, the more convinced he was "the peoples of the world need Christ." He read, he made notes. he made a great leather globe of the world and, one day, in the quietness of his cobbler's shop not in some enthusiastic missionary conference heard the call: "If it be the duty of all men to believe the Gospel ... then it be the duty of those who are entrusted with the Gospel to endeavor to make it known among all nations." And Carey sobbed out, "Here am I; send me!"

To surrender was one thing to get to the field was quite another problem. There were no missionary societies and there was no real missionary interest. When Carey propounded this subject for discussion at a ministers' meeting, "Whether the command given to the apostles to teach all nations was not obligatory on all succeeding ministers to the end of the world, seeing that the accompanying promise was of equal extent," Dr. Ryland shouted, "Young man, sit down: when God pleases to covert the heathen. He will do it without your aid or mine." Andrew Fuller added his

feelings as resembling the unbelieving captain of Israel, who said, "If the Lord should make windows in heaven, might such a thing be!"

But Carey persisted. he later said of his ministry, "I can plod!" And he was a man who "always resolutely determined never to give up on any point or particle of anything on which his mind was set until he had arrived at a clear knowledge of his subject."

Thus Carey wrote his famed Enquiry Into the Obligations of the Christians to Use Means for the Conversion of the Heathen. In this masterpiece on missions Carey answered arguments, surveyed the history of missions from apostolic times, surveyed the entire known world as to countries, size, population and religions, and dealt with the practical application of how to reach the world for Christ!

And he prayed. And he pled. And he plodded. And he persisted. And he preached especially his epoch-producing message, "EXPECT GREAT THINGS FROM GOD. ATTEMPT GREAT THINGS FOR GOD." The result of that message preached at Nottingham, May 30, 1792 and all the other missionary ministries of Carey produced the particular Baptist

Missionary Society, formed that Fall at Kettering on October 2, 1792. A subscription was started and, ironically, Carey could not contribute any money toward it except the pledge of the profit from his book, *The Enquiry*.


It was in 1793 that Carey went to India. At first his wife was reluctant to go so Carev set off to go nevertheless, but after two returns from the docks to persuade her again, Dorothy and his children accompanied him. They arrived with a Dr. Thomas at the mouth of the Hooghly in India in November, 1793. There were years of discouragement (no Indian convert for seven years), debt, disease, deterioration of his wife's mind, death, but by the grace of God and by the power of the Word Carey continued and conquered for Christ!

When he died at 73 (1834), he

had seen the Scriptures translated and printed into forty languages, he had been a college professor, and had founded a college at Serampore. He had seen India open its doors to missionaries, he had seen the edict passed prohibiting sati (burning widows on the funeral pyres of their dead husbands), and he had seen converts for Christ.

On his deathbed Carey called out to a missionary friend, "Dr. Duff! You have been speaking about Dr. Carey; when I am gone, say nothing about Dr. Carey speak about Dr. Carey's God." That charge was symbolic of Carey, considered by many to be a "unique figure, towering above both contemporaries and successors" in the ministry of missions.

Question and **Answer**

Will Online Church replace the need for a local church and in-person attendance?

People often ask "I attend the online services of an International Mega Church and have been blessed by the teaching. Should I still find or attend any local church?"

The episode of COVID pandemic and need for human isolation, introduced us to many new ways of staying connected virtually especially through online channels. Though physically isolated, we all have been blessed by being able to attend the online church services either through social media streaming websites or online meeting platforms like zoom. This pandemic season ensured that all are educated of the available online resources for staying connected, whether they liked this approach in the past or not.

In this course of time, many have also registered themselves as online virtual members of some International Mega Churches and been viewing their online services. Now that the pandemic has ended, many still wonder if they really need to

find a local church? (Especially comparing the local churches to the online mega church) And/ Or the need to attend a church service physically?. In the rest of this article, we will try to find a Biblical answer to this trending modern question.

First of all we need to understand the correct meaning of the word "Church" based on the Bible definition. The "Church" is NOT a building or a meeting place or even a denomination It is the "Body of Christ" (Eph 4:11-13, Rom 12:4-5, 1 Cor 12:27) Meaning, the group of Believers of Jesus Christ. The Lord Jesus Christ himself is the Head of the Church (Eph 1:22, Eph 5:23, Col 1:18) The Bride Groom and the church being called His Bride! (Rev 19:7, 21:2). Hence the real essence of Church is "The group of believers" coming together in a place - United in the Spirit, Confessing Jesus Christ as the Lord and Fellowshipping with each other for Spiritual edification. This role model was set by the disciples / apostles in the early church as well when they met together in groups to

worship the Risen Lord and fellowship with each other (Acts 2: 40-47). Further The participation in the Lords Table (Holy Communion) is a sign of unity of the Church and the Lord Jesus Christ (1 Cor 10: 16-17).

There is a great significance of "Christian Fellowship" as a Church (Group of Believers). We have been instructed to meet regularly to worship the Lord as a Church (In any Church Building) and also fellowship with each other as one family of believers caring for each other (Heb 10:24-25, 1 Thes 5:11, Col 3:16, Rom 14:19, 15:2). es indeed! This Bible verse is so true! It was a blessing for the IMC Poor Fund team as we visited two De-addiction Centers on Saturday, 26th August 2023 to distribute Rations to the Poor & Needy. Fifteen of us had a blessed time of meeting these hurting people and singing & sharing Jesus' love with them. We were blessed to have Pastor Alexander join us during the visits and share God's Word and His love for the hurting & rejected.

The first place we visited was Matha Foundation - a Convalescent Home as well as a Residential Half-Way Home for alcoholics and drug users located in Margondanahalli Village near T.C. Palya. It houses on an average 65-80 people at a time. We were shocked to see young boys aged 18-20 years being treated here. From their teens they have fallen prey to drugs, ganja, & alcohol. Medical facilities, Counselling & Encouragement are provided. The Founder of this Home was himself an alcoholic who had reached the lowest depths of depravity but today stands witness to the help provided by concerned people. Having been there, he was determined to help others and today this Center has a good success rate.

The second place we visited was Sree Nithi Trust located in Mandur Village, Virgonagar. Here around 25 men are being treated for alcoholism & drug related issues. Here too Medical facilities, Counselling & treatment is given for their addictions. The Center has a tie-up with Victoria Hospital to provide counselling, regular check-ups & medication. The Founder himself is a recovered alcoholic and is determined to help others. Pastor Alexander shared the Word of God here also and prayed for the inmates.

We provided Rations comprising of Rice, Rava, Sugar, Ragi, Cooking Oil, Pulses, Jaggery Powder, Wheat Flour, etc., to both the above places. We could do this only because of the generous contributions of IMC members who so caringly contribute towards the Poor Fund.

We also received a Birthday offering to the Poor Fund from a family. Cup Cakes were distributed to the inmates of Matha Foundation during our visit. We Thank the family for their love & concern for the Poor & Needy.

These visits could not have been possible without the support & guidance of our Senior Pastor Rev. Paul Royappa. Thank you Pastor!

God's Love is so wide & wonderful and we are happy & Blessed to share it. A Big Thank You to all the contributors, supporters & well-wishers of the IMC Poor Fund.
