As the Psalmist says in Psalm 85: 6, 'Will you not revive us again, that your people may rejoice in you', we need Revival all the time, again and again and again.

WHAT IS REVIVAL? Revival is simply getting personally right with God. Revival is a visitation of God which brings renewed life to Christians who have been sleeping, restoring them, producing a deep sense of God's presence and holiness, real joy, purpose and a reenergized zeal.

Today, we live in a high-tech world. Technology points us forward to a newer and supposedly "better" world. We need to remember that technology is neither good nor bad. It is simply a tool, and not a lifestyle. Unfortunately,

technology has been “the way” humanity lives and survives. But we are called by God to live a different “way”, that is, the way of Jesus. In fact, the early Christian church referred to the Jesus movement as “the way”. For us, today, we need a “different way” of living the Christian life in the modern world.

In the Bible, the term “revival” is not used explicitly. However, the concept of revival can be found throughout the Bible, and there are many reasons why revival is needed, according to the Scriptures:

No. 1. To Return to God: Revival is needed when people have strayed from God. 2 Chronicles 7:14 says, “Then if my people who are called by my name will humble themselves and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways. I will hear from heaven and will forgive their sins and restore their land”. Revival involves turning back to God and seeking Him with all our hearts.

No. 2. To Restore Spiritual Passion: Revival is needed to ignite a new passion for God and His purposes. Revelation 2:45 says, “Nevertheless, I have this against you, that you have left your first love. Remember,

therefore, from where you have fallen; repent and do the first works, or else I will come to you quickly and remove your lampstand from its place unless you repent”. Revival involves repenting of our spiritual dryness and pursuing God with new zeal.

No. 3. To Bring Transformation: Revival might start as a personal renewal but can also transform churches and communities and spread nationwide. In Acts 2, when the Holy Spirit was poured out on the disciples, it resulted in the conversion of thousands of people and the birth of the Early Church. Revivals have been a significant part of church history. Revival is needed because it brings us back to God and transforms our lives.

It is time to pray and cry out to God, Lord, I want a revival ignited in me, my family, community and my Church.

We want to thank you all for supporting the ministry of our Church through your generous giving and prayers all through the past year. Looking forward to your continued support and prayers this year. We assure you all of our prayers.

William Butler (1818-1899) and Clementina Rowe (1820-1913)

As we observe MCI (Methodist Church in India) formation day, this month, let us take a few moments to look back on the life and legacy of The Butlers, who were instrumental in establishing the Methodist movement in this great nation of ours.

The Butlers were probably the best-known Methodist missionary couple in the late nineteenth century. Born in Ireland, William Butler underwent a conversion experience, joined the Wesleyan church, and became a minister. He immigrated to the U.S. in 1850. After being twice widowed, he wrote to Clementina Rowe in Ireland, who had been influenced by his preaching some years before. Clementina crossed the ocean and they married in 1854.

In 1856 the Butlers sailed to India

as founders of American Methodist work. After their arrival, the Sepoy Mutiny broke out and they fled to the mountains, where they remained under siege for eight months. After the uprising was crushed, they opened orphanages for children left homeless by the rebellion. In 1865, after putting the church on a firm footing, the Butlers returned to the United States, where they vigorously promoted foreign missions. Clementina spoke to groups of Congregational and Methodist women about the needs of women in India. In response, women in both denominations founded women's missionary societies to support single women missionaries. Clementina was a founder of the Woman's Foreign Missionary

Society of the Methodist Episcopal Church and served over the years as an officer and recruiter.

As secretary of the American and Foreign Christian Union, an organization devoted to missions in "papal lands," William was deemed the best person to found Methodist work in Mexico in 1873. As they had done in India, the Butlers established a printing press, schools, a girls' orphanage, and church buildings. William wrote, *The Land of the Veda* (1871), *From Boston to Bareilly and Back* (1886), and *Mexico in Transition* (1892). Clementina established the Zenana Paper fund that published Christian women's literature in five vernaculars.

Two children continued the work of their parents. John W. Butler spent 44 years in Mexico as a Methodist missionary. Their daughter, Clementina Butler, wrote mission books for women, was secretary of the American Ramabai Association, and founded in 1912 the Committee on Christian Literature for Women and Children in Mission Fields.

A brief history of MCI: The year 1870 marked the beginning of a new era in the history of Methodism in India. The famous evangelist William Taylor was invited to India to hold special

revival meetings. It was this that changed the course of Methodism in India and led our church out of its provincial boundaries and made it a national factor

The year 1870 is also remarkable in our history as the year that marked the coming of the first missionaries of the Women's Foreign Missionary Society of the Methodist Episcopal Church. Two young ladies arrived that year: Isabella Thoburn, to start her wonderful work of education among India's girls and women; and Clara Swain, to inaugurate medical work among the women. We were, however, early led into an evangelistic work in the villages of Northern India that resulted in the baptism of large numbers of people from among the depressed classes. Thus started our mass Movement work, which has brought several hundreds of thousands of converts into our church in the rural areas.

In 1930 the Central Conference of Southern Asia elected Jaswant Rao Chitambar, as first national bishop, marking the beginning of a new era.

On August 15, 1947 India celebrated her first "Independence Day" making it a national holiday. The leadership of all departments of political life

became Indian. In keeping with this, on the retirement of Bishops Pickett and Rockey on November 11, 1956, two new Indian bishops were consecrated, namely, Mangal Singh with his experience in schools and pastoral work coming from the Delhi Conference and Gabriel Sundaram with his years of experience in the educational work of the church. Thus all four of the College of Bishops for India were now Indians. A report of Vernacular VBS Follow up 2023

Around 50 children from the nearby colony come to our church for a follow up every third Saturday at 3 pm. This has been happening from June 2022 till date. A team of teachers and volunteers minister to them through action songs and Bible Stories. Higher class children are given work sheet connected to the story of the day. In the month of November, we organised sports for them. According to their ages, different events such as picking chocolates, bursting balloons, three-legged race, biscuit champion and lemon and spoon race were organized. The children participated with much enthusiasm. Prizes were distributed to the winners.

On December 15, 2023 a Christmas Program was conducted for the children and their parents. Children showcased their learning from Christmas stories as play, choreography and songs. A powerful gospel message was preached by our Pastor Alexander. Many people went up to the front and committed their lives to Christ when the altar call was given. Santa Claus (one among them) wished all of them 'Merry Christmas'. Christmas gifts were given to the children and the parents. The program ended with a sumptuous dinner. Altogether 320 parents and children had participated.

As once a month seemed less frequent, a team of teachers decided to go to the colony every Thursday from June 2023. A believer has opened his house for this meeting. About 20 children participate in the gathering regularly. They eagerly wait for this time of fellowship. They have learnt to pray for themselves and for others. During the Christmas time, we visited the families of children who regularly attend the weekly and monthly fellowships and greeted each family with songs and a Christmas cake. We were received with open-arms by all of the families. The parents requested us to visit them more often and pray with them.

We request the church to uphold this ministry by their constant prayers. It is observed that many young boys of the colony drop out of school as they lack motivation to study and there is none to guide them. We need young committed professionals to join hands in this ministry. We know when one young person comes to know Jesus, his life will be changed completely. Many mothers accompany their children for the monthly follow up meetings and they request us to conduct meetings for them too and teach from the Bible. We need volunteers to teach the mothers, guide them and mentor them so their families come to know the Lord and grow in faith.

Harvest is plentiful but the labourers are few. Let us act swiftly before this open-door close.

New Year

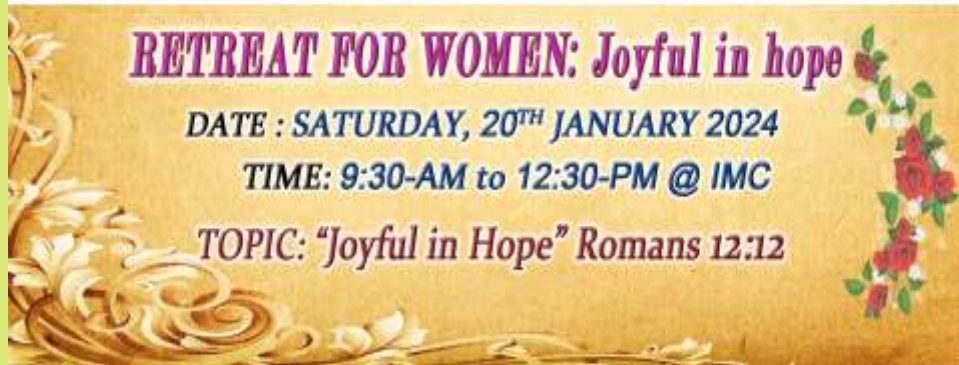
