# Pastoral Letter

#### Dear IMC Family,

Greetings to you all in the name of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. We are in the season of Lent; an opportunity the Church gives us every year for Spiritual renewal, transformation of mind, heart and action so that we can fulfil the two great commandments: "You must love the Lord your God with your whole heart, mind and strength. You must love your neighbour as yourself." (Mark 12:30:31) It is a time for us to rediscover the joy of the Gospel and to be "set free from sin, sorrow, inner emptiness and loneliness." In this Lenten season may we find the whole Church ready to bear witness, to all those who live in material, moral and spiritual destitution. We can do this to the extent that we imitate Christ who became poor and enriched us by his poverty. Lent is a fitting time for self-denial; we would do well to ask ourselves what we can give up, in order to help and enrich others. Let us not forget that real poverty hurts: no selfdenial is real without this dimension of repentance.

Lent is a season of prayer, fasting and helping those who are in need. It offers all of us an opportunity to prepare for Easter by a serious contemplation of our lives, with particular attention to the word of God which enlightens the daily journey of all who believe. So, our particular focus in Lent must be first of all on God, not ourselves. Secondly, it must be on our neighbor who is in need.

The theme for this month is "Living a Cross-Centred Life." How do we define the Cross? We read in 1 Peter 2:24 that the Cross is the place where all the wounds of sin are healed. If you suffer from emotional problems guilt, anxiety, depression, anger, or whatever, there is healing in the cross of Christ. If you are going through tragedy or suffering, there is comfort in abundance as you contemplate the sufferings of the spotless Savior on your behalf. After all, Peter wrote these very words to slaves who were suffering unjustly under cruel masters. The words about Christ's wound must have spoken to the hearts of these slaves who were whipped unjustly. Peter knew that meditating on the Cross would produce in them a heart of overflowing gratitude to the One who bore so much on their behalf.

"Cross-Centered" is a phrase we love to use. If someone asked if your life is centered on Christ,

how would you respond? Oftentimes a Cross-Centered life is associated with going to church, giving, praying, reading the Bible, and talking to other people about Jesus. But "Cross-Centered" is a lot easier to talk about than to live, isn't it? A lot of other things compete with Cross of Jesus for center stage in everyday life.

A Cross- Centered life begins with realizing that the source of everything we are is the Lord. He created us, He authors our story, and every blessing that we receive comes from Him. James 1:17 tells us that "Whatever is good and perfect is a gift coming down to us from God our Father, who created all the lights in the heaven" Additionally, Christ is the source of our daily righteousness. We simply cannot live up to biblical standards on our own; but in Christ, we have everything we need for godly living. "By his divine power, God has given us everything we need for living a godly life. We have received all of this by coming to know him, the one who called us to himself by means of his marvellous glory and excellence." (2 Peter 1:3).

A Cross-Centered life has one ultimate goal that is Jesus gets the glory. Because we want Christ to be known, honored, worshipped, and obeyed, we submit every other attainable goal to Him. Our decisions are no longer controlled by selfish desires, but instead, we will "live for Christ who died on the cross and was raised for them".

Our battle with self is one that will continue as long as we live in these earthly bodies. Keeping the Cross of Christ central will protect you from the many winds of false doctrine blowing in our day. The centrality of the cross is crucial to all sound doctrine. In this season of Lent. as we are meditating on the theme "Living a Cross-Centred Life", we are sure the messages on the theme that we hear during this month, will enable us to understand more about Jesus and grow in Him.

We invite you all to participate in our daily morning Lenten Online prayer time, Wednesday Lenten services, Passion Week Revival Meetings, Good Friday and Easter services and be blessed.

Thank God that we are organizing the **Methodist Young Adults Fellowship** (MYAF) on Mar 17<sup>th</sup>. We encourage young adults both married couples and singles aged between 25 & 39 to join and be blessed. Thank you all for

your constant prayer and financial support for the ministry of our Church. We too assure you all of our prayers.



#### William Tyndale: A Life Transformed by God's Word

When Tyndale was born, there was no Bible in the common language of the person in the pew. The Latin Vulgate was the only translation sanctioned by the Roman Catholic Church. Latin, however, was only used by the educated, which predominantly meant those leading the church.

Earlier English translations of the Bible had been translated in portions. The 8<sup>th</sup>-century Lindisfarne Gospels in Anglo-Saxon English and the 12<sup>th</sup>-century Wessex Gospels in Old English are two examples. But these manuscripts were kept in libraries accessible only to monks and priests. Additionally, most church parishioners were illiterate, and couldn't afford the expense of a book.

John Wycliffe's 14<sup>th</sup>-century Bible translation into Middle English made significant strides in the translation process. It also unleashed questions about the Catholic Church's theology, teaching and practice in light of Biblical truths now accessible to scholars and parishioners. In fact, by Tyndale's time, the Catholic Church had ruled the translation of the Bible punishable by death.

Early

Years

Born in western England near the Welsh border, Tyndale came from wealthy land owners with some political influence. Enrolled at Oxford University at age 12, he mastered multiple languages, including German, French, and Italian, as well as academic languages like Latin, Hebrew, and Greek. After completing his Master of Arts, Tyndale studied for four years at Cambridge University. Lutheran ideas from the continent had seeped into Cambridge and it is perhaps here that Tyndale began to acquire Protestant convictions.

#### **Transation Work**

Tyndalel began his translation work in London in 1523, the Church's opposition to translators forced him to move to Hamburg, Germany to continue his work. Many scholars suspect he met Martin Luther during this time. Regardless, he knew of Luther's protestations against the Catholic Church as well as Luther's German Bible translation two years earlier.

Despite sabotage of his early work, Tyndale completed his New Testament translation in 1525. Approximately 15,000 copies were smuggled into England over the next five years. The Catholic Church confiscated and destroyed many of these Bibles, but were ultimately unable to contain the spread.

Though he's known for his Bible translation, Tyndale wrote other material during this time. One, *The Practice of Prelates* (1530), was a very public rebuke of King Henry VIII's desire for a divorce. This brought Tyndale under the ire of Henry, who sought Tyndale's extradition from Germany.

Tyndale stayed in Germany and continued to work on revisions of his Bible until 1535. While tweaking his New Testament translation, Tyndale began working on the Old Testament, completing the Pentateuch and some of the historical books.

#### **Final End**

In May 1535, while taking a walk through town, Tyndale was betrayed, abducted and handed over to authorities of the Holy Roman Empire. He was jailed in a castle outside Brussels for over a year. The next year, on October 6, 1536, William Tyndale was convicted of heresy, strangled to death while tied to a stake and his dead body burned. The father of the English Bible never returned to England. His is the first Bible printed on Gutenberg's printing press invented seven decades earlier, and circulated more quickly than any previous English translations.

#### **Dying Wish**

Tyndale's last words before his

strangulation were, "Open the King of England's eyes." Tyndale's prayers were answered. Within a year of his death, King Henry VIII gave his authorization for an English translation of the Bible to be completed, which was done by Myles Coverdale, a friend of Tyndale. The English-speaking world stands in debt to Tyndale's godly desires, and to God, who brought them to fruition.

#### **Conclusion:**

What did it cost Tyndale to rescue the Bible for the common people and to rescue the gospel. the church, justification by faith for the common man in England. What did it cost him? He left his homeland in 1524, 12 years before his death, and ever went home again. He was killed in 1536. It gives a little glimpse of his exile life, always knowing he could be betrayed, always knowing somebody could turn him in, always knowing he could be extradited because the Roman Church covered the whole of Europe. We are the heirs of an amazing legacy. The Bible that you hold in your hand, or have in your backpack, or back in your room cost Tyndale and many others their lives. Don't spare any effort in thought, or any effort in work, to read it and know it.
