Pastoral Letter

Dear IMC family,

Greetings to you all in the matchless name of our Lord and saviour Jesus Christ.

As human beings we all go through numerous trials, temptation and loss but how do we collect ourselves after that stressful event? May the Lord be with us every moment of this month, guard us and guide us, empower us by His Holy Spirit to live as His witnesses in this world.

Last month we focused on the theme 'Values of a true Christian' and this month we, the pastoral team have prayerfully chosen the theme 'Developing **Emotional Resilience**'. What is emotional resilience? Emotional resilience is when you are able to calm your frantic mind after encountering a negative experience. It is intrinsic motivation, an inner force by which we can hold ourselves through all the downside of life. Just like other aspects of our persona.

Emotional resilience is not about winning the battle. It is the strength to power through the storm and still keep the sail steady. Living in the era of technological revolution, every ten years we adapt to changes that never exited in our life before. From rigorous

digitalization to the 24/7 social media influence, from the changing professions to adapting with the ways of younger generation, it is only natural to feel emotionally tied down at times.

Someone has rightly said, "the greatest glory in living lies not in never falling, but in rising every time we fall". The word resilience originates from Latin word, (*Resilio*-which means "to bounce back or retaliate) the word is usually associated with withstanding shock, returning to form, maintaining strength, and not giving up.

Emotional resilience is an art of living that is entwined with self-belief, self- compassion, and enhanced cognition. It is the way through which we empower ourselves to perceive adversities as 'temporary' and keep evolving through the pain and sufferings.

The scripture does not use the word "resilience". But the word "perseverance" is found repeatedly in Holy Scripture. It seems to capture the idea of resilience. At times the bible describes resilience in battle terms: though the righteous fall seven times, they rise again. (Prov. 24:16).

And in James. 1:2-4 it says, consider it pure joy, my brothers and sisters, whenever you face trials of

many kinds, because you know that the testing of your faith produces perseverance. Let perseverance finish its work so that you may be mature and complete, not lacking anything.

The word also means "to evaluate." When James says to "count it all joy," he encourages his readers to evaluate the way they look at trials. He calls believers to develop a new and improved attitude that considers trials from God's perspective. According to him there will be trials in Christian life. But consider it as joy. Because, they exist for a purpose. Trials have the potential of producing something good in us, and, for this reason, they are an opportunity for expressing joy. Knowing there is a bigger picture, we can consider trials as things to rejoice in. Even though joy is contrary to our normal reaction, James urges us to work on changing our attitude toward troubles from dread to positive expectation, faith, trust, and even joy.

So, here James explains that God intends trials to test our faith and produce spiritual perseverance. Friends, trials are like training challenges for an athlete. They build physical endurance and stamina. The athlete looks forward to physical and mental challenges because of the benefits that follow. If we were to walk through life on easy street

and never face hardship, our Christian character would remain untested and underdeveloped. Trials develop our spiritual muscles, giving us the stamina and endurance to stay on the course.

So, how can we develop emotional resilience? by being aware of our inner potentials. The only thing that differentiates an emotionally resilient and an emotionally fragile person is the way the former chooses to 'respond'. Let us therefore conquer the battle in our mind through the Power of Holy Spirit. Let us learn to live with a renewed mind set and being rooted and built up on Him. So that nothing can shake us and nothing can break us.

Thank God that the third parsonage was dedicated on Sunday, May 5, 2024 by our Bishop N L Karkare and assisted by our District Superintendent Rev. Sebastian Ravi Kumar. Now we all three Pastors are staying on the Church premises, Annexe 3rd floor. We express our heartfelt thanks to our Bishop and DS for their constant support and prayers. We also thank you all for the way you have been supporting the ministry and needs of our Church through prayers and finance. We too assure you all of our prayers.

Vernacular Teen's Camp Report May 4, 2024

Location: Our church premises served as the most suited place for our vernacular children's Teen's Camp, providing a nurturing environment for spiritual enlightenment.

Objective: The camp aimed to deepen the faith of vernacular teenagers through worship session, devotion, collaborative activity, practical talk and fellowship lunch, fostering a sense of belonging and spiritual resilience.

Participants: 88 enthusiastic teenagers aged between 13 to 17, belonging to various colonies in and around Indiranagar eagerly participated in the camp. They were members of our vernacular VBS community from diverse family back grounds.

Highlights:

- 1. Worship and Prayer: The day commenced with a vibrant worship session that uplifted spirits as participants worshipped God through music, prayer, and praise. Teens were encouraged to express their love for God in their vernacular languages.
- **2. Morning Devotion:** After the worship, a soul-stirring devotion was led by our resource team from Scripture Union headed by

Mr and Ms Deepak, focusing on the theme of Christian Identity. These sessions set the spiritual tone for the day, inspiring participants to throw away the mask they wear and come to Lord Jesus who gives them a true identity.

- 3. Collaborative activity: Thought-provoking group activity was organized for the children. They were divided into 10 groups. Each group was given one human organ such as eye, ear, heart, hand and leg. They were asked make a poster on sins committed by the organ assigned to them on a chart paper for 20 mins. The team leader presented their work to the whole group after 20 mins. At the end, the resource person consolidated from the Bible that only with Jesus we can overcome these temptations and by confessing our sins to Him we receive forgiveness.
- 4. Practical Talk: This session was conducted for boys and girls separately. Mr Deepak addressed the boys and Ms Shalini Deepak spoke to the girls. Mr Deepak brought out the struggles of a teen-age boy from Joseph's life and challenged the boys that it is their choice to come to Jesus so that they can live a

clean and victorious Christian life.

Ms Shalini encouraged the girls to say no to unacceptable acts and to be wise on using social media. She explained to them the importance of regular Bible Reading and Prayer to grow in the Lord.

The camp provided ample opportunities for fellowship and fun through games, teambuilding activities, and reflections. These moments of laughter and camaraderie strengthened bonds within the group and created lasting memories. The camp concluded with a sumptuous meal. Bibles were given to those who asked for it.

Impact: The vernacular Teen's Camp left a profound impact on the participants, deepening their

relationship with God. Many expressed gratitude for the opportunity.

The vernacular Teen's Camp was a testament to the benevolence of IMC members a n d transformative power of faith in the Lord. Through worship, fellowship, and interactive sessions, the teenagers experienced God's love in tangible ways, equipping them to shine as lights in their families, schools, communities. As they departed from the camp, they carried with them a renewed sense of purpose and a burning passion to live out their faith boldly in the world.

Why do I Love God?

oday, I want to share a testimony of the many mercies God has shown me, in the hope that it will soothe another's heart, fill them with courage and patience, and remind them that prayers for their future will come true through His grace alone.

For a good part of a year, I felt helpless after being laid off from my job. Despite the support and love of my wonderful family, I felt useless because I couldn't contribute financially. This feeling intensified when we made a significant financial commitment, highlighting the hardship we'd face if I

didn't find a job soon. As the months passed, I worried that my growing employment gap would make me ineligible for future opportunities.

During this time, I prayed earnestly to the Lord for help. My prayers were filled with cries for a way to support my family. I could see the pressure affecting them, even though they never projected it onto me. It pained me to see them worry about the future, making me feel worthless and helpless.

Shame washed over me as I watched friends and former colleagues advance in their careers. Although happy for them, I feared I was being left behind. Yet, throughout these times, God consoled me, calming my heart and wiping away my worries and shame. When I prayed earnestly, Jesus would pacify me with His peace, promising that He was working His grace in my life, just as it says in Isaiah 43:18-19:

"Forget the former things; do not dwell on the past. See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland."

A short while ago, while praying, Jesus led me to John 16. As I read verses 22-24, I felt God instructing me to pray without guilt or shame:

"So with you: Now is your time of grief, but I will see you again and you will rejoice, and no one will take away your joy. In that day you will no longer ask me anything. Very truly I tell you, my Father will give you whatever you ask in my name. Until now you have not asked for anything in my name. Ask and you will receive, and your joy will be complete."

That night, I prayed wholeheartedly for my family's well-being and for a job. I felt Jesus sitting next to me, holding my hand, and listening to my every word. Peace washed over me, and I knew God was with me, empowering me to face any challenge.

A few weeks later, I received a call for an interview with a major company. Despite my nerves and self-doubt, I thanked God for the opportunity. Throughout the interview process, I prayed constantly. To my amazement, I was selected for the job. This miracle was possible only because God was with me, guiding my thoughts, words, and actions.

I believe God has placed me in this job for a reason, and I am committed to reflecting His honor and glory through my work. My family and I are immensely grateful for this opportunity. I encourage anyone unhappy in their job or seeking new opportunities to not lose hope. Spend time in prayer, asking for your heart's desires, because our God is a giving and promisefulfilling God. Amen.



Back to School, with Jesus!



Biography: JEREMIAH, THE WEEPING PROPHET

s we meditate on emotional resilience this month, here's a brief biography of Prophet Jeremiah,

known as the "Weeping Prophet," to encourage us in our own journey of emotional resilience building. Jeremiah was a significant figure in the southern kingdom of Judah during the tumultuous period leading up to the Babylonian exile12. Born into a priestly family, near Jerusalem, Jeremiah was called to prophethood around 627/626 BC, during the reign of King Josiah.

Jeremiah's ministry spanned over four decades, a time marked by political upheaval and spiritual decay. He witnessed the fall of the Assyrian empire, the rise of the Neo-Babylonian empire, and the ultimate destruction of Jerusalem and the Temple in 586 BC12. His prophecies often centered on themes of judgment and repentance, reflecting the dire circumstances of his homeland.

Despite his stern messages, Jeremiah's emotional depth is evident throughout his prophetic book. He openly expressed his sorrow and compassion for his people, lamenting their impending doom and the suffering they would endure 2. His empathy for his fellow Judaeans and his anguish over their stubbornness and sin are palpable, earning him the title of the "Weeping Prophet."

Jeremiah's emotional struggles also included feelings of isolation and rejection, as his prophecies were frequently met with hostility and disbelief. He endured persecution and imprisonment, yet he remained steadfast in delivering God's message. His personal laments, found in the "confessions of Jeremiah," (Jeremiah 11:1812:6; 15:1021; 17:910, 1418; 18:1823; 20:712, 1418) reveal Jeremiah's emotional side, his struggles with his prophetic mission, and his feelings of isolation and sorrow, which are central to his identity as the "Weeping Prophet." Yet through all this, he reaffirms his trust in God's salvation and deliverance as an outcome of his deeply personal and intimate relationship he had with God.

In the end, Jeremiah's life was a testament to his unwavering faith and his profound emotional connection to his people and to God. Jeremiah's unwavering commitment to his prophetic mission, despite personal suffering, encourages us to remain steadfast in our Christian journey, knowing that God is with us through our trials, just as He was with Jeremiah.
