Dear IMC Family,

WE WISH YOU ALL A HAPPY & BLESSED NEW YEAR 2025. May the Lord be with us every moment of this year, guard us, guide us and empower us by His Holy Spirit to live as His witness in this world.

We thank and praise God for the way, He led us wonderfully all through the past year. Yes, we all encountered Good times and difficult times in 2024, but through it all God has been faithful to us. As the Apostle Paul says in **Rom 8:28, we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love Him.**

In our journey of faith, we often find ourselves facing moments of uncertainty and fear. We are called to take steps into places and situations that are unfamiliar, perhaps even daunting. Yet, it is in these moments that God's presence and His promises shine brightest. The theme that we have chosen for Jan 2025 is **"Stepping into the Unknown"**- Lessons from the Book of Joshua.

The book of Joshua offers us profound wisdom as we navigate our own "unknowns" in life.

1. God's Promise to Lead Us (Joshua - 1)

When Moses, the great leader of Israel, passed away, Joshua found himself stepping into a leadership role that was both an honour and a heavy responsibility. The future was uncertain. The people of Israel were about to face challenges they had never encountered before. Yet, in the midst of these uncertainties, God spoke directly to Joshua, saying: "Be strong and courageous... I will be with you wherever you go" (Joshua 1:9).

God's promise is clear: He will not leave us or forsake us. Stepping into the unknown is not about relying on our own strength, but trusting in God's unwavering presence. Just as God assured Joshua. He assures us as we begin this New Year. In our personal and collective journeys, we are never alone. When faced with the unknown, remember that God's presence is constant guidance and His is trustworthy. Step forward with courage, knowing He is leading vou. Trust in God's instructions and act in

obedience, even when His path seems uncertain. He will make a way, just as He did for the Israelites.

2. God's Presence Goes Before Us (Joshua - 3)

Joshua instructed the people to follow the Ark of the Covenant, a tangible sign of God's presence, as it led the way into uncharted territory. When we face the unknown, we are reminded that God goes ahead of us, preparing the way. The Israelites were told to keep their eyes on the Ark and follow it closely.

In your own life, where do you need to fix your eyes on God and trust His leading? Seek His presence through prayer, Scripture, and worship as you take the next step. The priests carrying the Ark were commanded to step into the Jordan River before the waters parted. It was only when they obeyed and took that first step that God performed the miracle of stopping the river's flow.

Faith requires action. Sometimes, we must step forward in obedience, even when the outcome is unclear, trusting that God will intervene at the right moment. What is God calling you to do today that requires faith, Are you willing to take that first step, trusting that He will provide? Before the crossing, Joshua told the people, "Consecrate yourselves, for tomorrow the Lord will do amazing things among you." Preparation through spiritual cleansing and dedication was essential to witnessing God's power.

Stepping into the unknown isn't just about external action; it's also about preparing our hearts and living for God's work. Are there areas in your life that need spiritual renewal? How can you consecrate yourself to be ready for what God wants to do in and through you?

3. Victory through Faith and Obedience (Joshua - 6)

The fall of Jericho is one of the most dramatic victories in Scripture. The Israelites' success was not a result of their own strength or strategy but of their obedience to God's unconventional instructions. Marching around the city for seven days with trumpets may have seemed foolish to some, but it demonstrated unwavering trust in God's plan. As we step into the unknown, let us be reminded that true victory comes not through our understanding but through faith and obedience to God's Word. There will be times when His instructions may not align with our logic, but His ways are always higher than ours.

4. Remember God's Faithfulness (Joshua - 24)

When stepping into unfamiliar territory, it's crucial to look back and remember how God has provided, protected, and guided us. Joshua reminds Israel that their victories were not their own but the result of God's hand at work. Similarly, we are called to trust in the God who has been faithful in our past to lead us into the future.

The unknown often brings a crossroad, where we must choose whom or what we will rely on. Joshua's bold declaration, "As for me and my household, we will serve the Lord," is a call for unwavering commitment. When faced with uncertainty, let us reaffirm our trust in God's sovereignty and commit to walking in His ways. Joshua renews the

covenant between God and His people, emphasizing their responsibility to live in obedience and faithfulness. As we step into the unknown, it's a time to renew our dedication to God's Word and His promises, trusting that His plans for us are good (Jeremiah 29:11).

Joshua's leadership was a reflection of God's guidance. The same God who led Israel through uncharted territories leads us today. In moments of fear or hesitation, we can take courage knowing that the God who parted the Jordan River is with us, guiding each step. As we, like Israel, step forward into new seasons, let us do so with faith in God's promises. May we choose to serve Him wholeheartedly, remembering His faithfulness, and trusting in His plan.

Charles Wesley

harles Wesley, along with his older brother John Wesley, was a founder of Methodist societies as well as a Methodist hymn writer and preacher. His 6,500 hymns, seventeen years of itinerant preaching, and superintendence of the London societies make him a major figure in the creation of the Methodist movement. His love for the Church of England is largely responsible for the Anglican tradition within Methodism.

Early Life and Travels

Born in Epworth Rectory, Lincolnshire, England, on December 18, 1707, Wesley was the third surviving son and probably the eighteenth child of Susanna and Samuel Wesley. He was educated first by his mother and then at Westminster School and Christ Church College, Oxford. In 1729, while at Oxford, he initiated the Holy Club, whose members were nicknamed



Methodists. One of those who joined the club was the future evangelist George Whitefield, who was then studying at Oxford's Pembroke College. Wesley received an A.B. degree in 1730 and an M.A. degree in 1733.

Ordained a deacon and priest in 1735, Wesley accompanied his brother John, a missionary for the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel in Foreign Parts, to Georgia. Charles served as secretary to James Edward Oglethorpe, Georgia's founder, and as chaplain at Fort Frederica on St. Simons Island. The experience was not a positive one for Charles. His strictness in matters of religion caused difficulties, and he returned to England in 1736.

Charles's spirits were buoyed by John's return from Georgia in February 1738. Charles hoped to return to Georgia as a missionary, but ill health prevented it. He had been very impressed by the Moravians he had met in America, and in February 1738 he travelled to Oxford, where he met Peter Bohler, a Moravian missionary, and began teaching Bohler to speak English. His association with Bohler led to Weslev's conversion on Pentecost, May 21, 1738.

Ministry & Final Days

Entering the itinerant ministry in 1739, Wesley preached to huge crowds, appearing with both his brother John and Whitefield. His collection Hymns and Sacred Poems was published that same year. According to one early Methodist, "His preaching at his best was thunder and lightning." In 1749 Wesley married Sarah Gwynne. The couple had eight children, but only three of them survived to maturity. Wesley continued to travel until 1756, but his emotional preaching took a toll on his health, and he was frequently depressed.

In 1771 Wesley and his family moved from Bristol to London. where he served and superintended the Foundry and City Road Chapel. He continued to write hymns, and his two sons, Charles and Samuel, were considered musical prodigies. In 1780 Wesley's A Collection of Hymns for the Use of the People Called Methodists was first published. Other editions appeared in 1876 (with a supplement), 1904, and 1983. Collection, in which some hymns are attributed to both John and Charles Wesley, remains the standard Methodist hymnal. Wesley's commitment to God and man is expressed in such hymns as "Hark! The Herald Angels Sing," "Love Divine," and "Christ the Lord Is Risen Today." His final hymn penned in his deathbed in 1788 in London was "In age and feebleness extreme, Who shall a helpless worm redeem? Jesus, my only hope Thou art, Strength of my failing flesh and heart:

O could I catch one smile from Thee, And drop into eternity!"
